

Roland Classroom Activity: HP302 Piano

Lesson: Steady Beat

Concepts: Downbeats, Finding the Pulse, Counting a Steady Beat

Grades: K-6, 20 minutes

National Standards Met:

Standard 2: Performing on instruments, alone and with others, a varied repertoire of music.

Students drum the pulse in a variety of music styles.

Preparation:

Three SONG files: #31: Radetzky Marsch

#46: Humoreske #71: Fly Free Standard 6: Listening to, analyzing, and describing music

Students listen to music files, find the pulse, then play

Detailed Lesson Plan:

❖ Tell students they will be finding the PULSE in different music.

- Play Radetzky Marsch. Students walk, wave, stomp, clap to the music. Choose a gross motor activity.
- ❖ As students move, begin counting a steady beat "1 2 3 4" or "1 2 3". Ask students to count with you.
- ❖ As the music plays, begin counting "ONE" with a louder voice, slowly eliminating the remaining beats.
- ❖ Tell students that beat ONE, the strongest beat, is the DOWNBEAT. "We will be drumming DOWNBEATS ONLY on your piano"
- Instrument Options for remainder of lesson:

HP302, any tone selected Drum Sticks

Rhythm Sticks Hands tapping on legs

- ❖ Play Radetsky March. Students play/drum on DOWNBEAT ONLY.
- Play Humoreske. Listen together.
- ❖ Discuss the difference between pieces. Is this one faster? Slower?
- Students count with you, tapping the downbeat, accentuating ONE as they count.
- ❖ Play Fly Free. Listen together and discuss rhythm differences.
- Students play/drum a steady beat, accenting the downbeat.
